EMERSON'S JOURNEY The Essence of Our Impact

When Emerson was tragically diagnosed with Gaucher disease, a life-limiting genetic condition, she was seen by Boston Children's Hospital and her parents began navigating the new world of hospital systems and procedures. Fortunately, the palliative care team at Boston Children's referred Emerson's parents, Sarah and Steve, to Courageous Parents Network last fall. With your support, CPN launched a pilot Parent Education Series this spring. Sarah participated – along with a virtual group of other parents over four weeks, each week a different theme, facilitated by our content director and psychologist Nancy Frumer Styron.

In June, Emerson died unexpectedly from complications related to Gaucher. Shortly after Emerson's death, Sarah expressed how you help parents like her with your generosity: "Thank you again for what you do with the Courageous Parents Network. You have no idea how much the blog, videos, articles shared on Facebook, and parent education group, did to help us not only get through – but to actually embrace Emerson's journey, as hard as it was at times. She really was the best:)"

That last bit about helping her parents "embrace Emerson's journey" is what Courageous Parents Network is about and essentially what you help make possible. Sarah and Steve asked that gifts in honor of Emerson be made to CPN and we have received nearly \$3000 to date from grateful friends.

We helped this dad. Now he is helping others.

Greg reached out to us with his story. We interviewed Greg and Heidi so their story can help others experiencing similar emotions, challenges and hopes. Here's an excerpt from that interview.

Things were snowballing and Abby was getting worse. We don't know what tomorrow holds. We were grieving but for something we hadn't lost yet. I started doing Google research about "anticipatory grief" and found Courageous Parents Network. I saw the videos, I read the materials, and I thought, "That's us! That's exactly how I feel, what I'm going through. I'm looking at the palliative care materials and I said [to my wife], 'Heidi, this is exactly what Abby needs. We need something else to fill this void and pieces all the other doctors together to make sure Abby gets the best quality of life.' And that's when we found palliative care and it's been a Godsend.

In this moment, Abby is doing very well and Greg is on our Parent Advisory Board.

Our connection to one of CPN's most involved and supportive families, the Swoyers, goes back almost 30 years. life-limiting condition came early, came hard, and continues to this day as our respective sons turn 21 years old this year.
